

Health and Safety Plan



Committed to Safety

Safety continues to be one of our core values and we want you to know all that we are doing to keep your students safe during this pandemic. We want to love God well by being good stewards of all He has entrusted to us and love our guests well by providing a distraction-free environment to encounter the gospel.



It Starts With Us

We are working closely with our local health department officials to follow the recommendations set forth by the CDC and the Kentucky Department of Health to equip our staff and guests to minimize the spread of germs. All Crossings staff will be thoroughly educated in CDC approved sanitizing protocols.



Hand Sanitation Program

We will have hand sanitizing stations set up at strategic places around property and encourage our guest's frequent use. We will also be encouraging all guests to wash hands as much as possible throughout the day.



Rigorous Screening Process

All guests will sign a medical release form stating that they exhibited no symptoms associated with COVID-19 during the 14-day period leading up to their arrival on property. Any guest who has shown symptoms in that time span will not be permitted on any of our properties but will have the opportunity to be refunded. Temperature checks will happen for every guest prior to their arrival on property as well as daily temperature checks for all participants and staff while at camp.



We Keep It Clean

Our cleaning and sanitizing protocol will meet or exceed that which the CDC and Kentucky Department of Public Health have set forth. High traffic areas such as restrooms, meeting spaces, and indoor gathering areas will be cleaned and sanitized multiple times per day. Cabins will be cleaned and disinfected before campers arrive. Dining facilities will meet or exceed CDC sanitizing requirements.



Limiting Exposure

We will not be allowing any non-essential visitors on any of our properties. This excludes emergency situations.



Partnering With Guests

We want our guests and other responsible parties to be fully confident and informed on the health protocols we have in place to keep our guests safe. Frequently Asked Questions

Will my group need to wear a mask?

Your group will need to wear a face-covering when inside, excluding while eating and drinking. Participants will not need to wear face coverings when at the lake, while participating in outdoor activities, or while sleeping, eating, or drinking.

Will my group need to be tested before arrival?

Your group will not need to be tested prior to arriving at camp. Temperature checks will be required prior to the arrival of camp and on a daily basis.

Will I need to take my group's temperature each day?

Each participant's temperature will be taken every day.

If a participant in my group tests positive while at camp, will my group need to quarantine?

If a participant tests positive for COVID-19, the participant's parent or guardian should pick up, or have arranged to have picked up, the participant within 3 hours. When an individual tests positive for COVID-19, we will notify the group leaders of all participants in the tribe. Our staff, along with the group leaders and their adult chaperones will help determine which other students have had close contact with the individual and must be quarantined. The participants who had close contact with the individual who tested positive, will need to also be picked up and leave camp within 3 hours in order to quarantine. Campers returning from camp should consider minimizing in-person contact with any person 65 years of age or older, especially those with pre-existing health conditions, for a period of 14 days. This includes maintaining social distancing of at least 6 feet of separation from those individuals, wearing a face-covering or mask, and avoiding sharing utensils or other common objects with those individuals.

What will capacity be like?

We have reduced capacity in housing, dining, and meeting spaces for each camp session. This allows us to spread out within lodging and around property. Depending on changes to CDC, state, and local guidelines, we are currently planning to operate at a limited capacity in our dining hall and worship center, and across the entire property. We are also working hard to ensure that different groups will not be together in any of our housing.

What will cleaning look like?

High traffic areas such as restrooms, meeting spaces, and indoor gathering areas will be cleaned and sanitized multiple times per day. Cabins will be cleaned and disinfected before campers arrive. Dining facilities will be sanitized before every meal. Hand sanitizer stations will be readily available around property.

What will housing look like?

We will have reduced capacities in our housing units. We are recommending sleeping head to foot in each of our sleeping spaces.
