### **Missions Offering**

## Path to Panama/ IMB Partnership Panama & Western Columbia

Missions...taking the Gospel to those who have not heard it, is part of Crossings' DNA. Since Crossings began in 2000, campers have given \$2,229,036 to global missions causes around the world.

For the last three years, our missions focus has been eastern Kentucky. Our campers gave nearly \$500,000 for work in Appalachia. The missions offering has helped Crossings take Kids Day Camps to various sites in Kentucky.

Also, on July 28th, 2022, a devastating and tragic flood struck in the mountains and tragically took the lives of 43 people, including young children. The dollars given by campers to the missions offering went to Freda Harris Baptist Center in Elkhorn City and God's Appalachian Partnership in McDowell. These ministries have proven to be vital in the rebuilding of lives and homes in the flood area, all in the name of Jesus Christ.

This year begins our exciting partnership with the SBC International Mission Board (IMB) and our IMB missionaries in Panama and western Columbia. You and your campers will meet our missionaries via video during camp.

The goal of our partnership: to train local missionaries to go and tell indigenous peoples in Columbia and Panama the good news of Jesus Christ. These are people unreached with the Gospel.

During your session at camp, watch the missions videos and listen to testimonies given by those who have been to Panama or western Columbia. One of the missionaries you and your campers will meet in the vids is Dylan Duvall. Dylan was a Crossings camper not long ago, came back as a summer staffer and then served as an intern. While serving as a Crossings intern, Dylan clearly heard and answered God's call to go, currently serving a two year term as a journeyman with our IMB. Prayerfully consider your students' gift to the Path to Panama Missions Offering 2024 and what God himself would have them give. And pray that God will begin to show you how and where He would have your students serve Him, maybe in an area like Panama or western Columbia. We hope to help them begin to understand how to get "there," wherever "there" is for your students!

## Checklist

### 2 Weeks prior to your camp session

- □ Complete Background Check Form: All adults attending camp must have had a background check performed in the last 2 years and must be listed on the form. This online form is found on your Group Leader Dashboard under "Manage."
- □ Upload Certificate of Liability: Crossings Ministries with our Louisville address MUST be listed as the Certificate Holder. Your church insurance agent can provide you with this form, and you can upload it to your Group Leader Dashboard under "Manage," or you can email the form to info@gocrossings.org.
- □ Sales Tax Form: A KY Sales Tax Exemption Certificate must be provided in order to not be charged 6% sales tax.
- ☐ Ensure all participants' registrations have been completed.
- ☐ Final Camp Payment is due.

## **1st Time Group Leaders**

### **Connect**

This is your time to connect with your students. Each day, we make sure there is opportunity in the schedule for you to do what you understand to be the most helpful with your group. We have written some material for your use, but it is up to you if you want to use that. Regardless of what you decide, your students will be looking to you for some direction. Some groups encourage their students to rest or get cleaned up, some do TAWG (*Time Alone With God,*) and some go over our material. It's totally up to you!

### Checkpoint

Our desire is to always direct your students back to you in the significant decisions they are making at camp. As a result, we have scheduled time for you to check in with your students every night after worship. They will always be directed to respond to the invitation with their group leaders. Checkpoint follows evening worship so you can follow up with the students with whom the Lord is doing work.

### **POIs**

These POINTS OF IMPACT are our opportunity to entertain and engage your students with activities and communicate the Gospel to your students. They select their POIs upon arrival at property and these selections will be given to you at the opening group leader meeting.

### The Shack

Each night, we will finish up with some great activities and some delicious junk food. This takes place at "The Shack," which is our concession stand. The Shack is open during lake rotations and at the end of each day!

### **Fellowship**

This is a gathering of the entire camp on one evening of camp (the day depends on the camp property) for a fun, energetic, and festive party-like experience. It will take place during Shack and all Shack attractions still happen during the fellowship. Our desire is for there to be a special night of dressing up with a few exciting surprises along the way.

### **Breakthru**

BreakThru is a time for campers and our SMS to spend intentional time together as a small group. This can include making bracelets, playing icebreaker games, or some small group vs. small group gaga ball.

### Crossbowl

Crossbowl is a camp-wide competition where small groups, divided by their color, compete to be the ultimate Crossbowl Champion at the end of the session. Each morning, small groups will compete in team activities, ending with a final competition on the last night.

**Church Checkpoint:** We want to strengthen the relationship between students and their church leaders. This is a designated time for you to meet with your group, debrief, worship, and pray together.



**Bible Study:** We separate middle school and high school and give them in-depth exposition of God's Word from our camp pastor followed by a staff-led breakout time of discussion and application.



**POI | Point of Impact:** Students participate in one specialized activity per day, based on student preference. Activity followed by intentional Gospel discussion. See gocrossings.org/poi for a full list.



**Church Connect**: This is a designated time for you, the Group Leader, to connect with your students through devotions, discussions team building activities, or simply hanging out.

### **Dress Code**

We ask that all students and adults dress modestly.

#### For Females:

- Shorts need to be longer than fingertips when arm is extended down the side of the leg.
- No spaghetti strap tank tops or any tops where undergarments can be seen.
- Swimsuits must be one-piece with shorts/swim shorts won over swimsuit at all times, even in the water. If you do not have a one-piece swimsuit, a dark t-shirt and shorts must be worn over a tankini swimsuit at all times.
- Shirts must be worn over swimsuits at all times when walking to and from the lake/pool.

#### For Males:

- Shorts need to be longer than fingertips when arm is extended down the side of the leg.
- No shirts with sides cut out.
- Shirts must be worn at all times on campus, even when walking to and from the lake/pool.

### **How Many Adult Leaders Should I Bring?**

An important aspect in the ministry of Crossings is the relationships that students build with the adult leaders from their church. Crossings requests one adult for every five students (gender specific) in order to facilitate discipleship between students and adults that will extend beyond camp. As your students will be looking for guidance from the adults that come with your church, it is important that you bring adults who are at least 21 years old, maturing Christians, and can be examples to your students and lead them spiritually.

# What Is the Camp Rate and What Do the Accommodations Look Like for Adult Leaders?

The camp rate is the same for both students and adults. Your adult leaders will stay in the same accommodation as their students overnight. During POIs and recreation activities, we encourage leaders to hang out with their students. They may even participate in activities after every student has had their chance.

### **Are There Laundry Facilities?**

There are no laundry facilities available on property. Be sure to bring enough clothes for your entire stay.

## May Adult Leaders Bring Their Young Children?

Crossings' facilities do not have accommodations for parents to bring children who are too young or too old to register as students or kids. Because of the nature of camp and the busy schedule, it would be impossible for an Adult Leader to provide appropriate supervision for both their child/children and their group's students.

### Will I have Cell Phone Reception?

At Crossings, we pride ourselves on providing groups with a distraction-free environment. Therefore, cell service is very limited. We do provide Wi-Fi connectivity to adult chaperones only. This information will be provided upon arrival.

### Is there a Camp Nurse?

There will not be a camp nurse. We provide basic First Aid supplies and a First Aid Coordinator. More serious injuries can visit the closest hospital for medical help.

### How are food allergies handled?

If you have a member of your group with food allergies, please make sure this is noted on their Crossings Medical Release Form. Our staff will do everything we can to accommodate them and keep our kitchen staff aware of the student's needs. Please advise your student to find a member of the kitchen staff to discuss their options during mealtimes.

#### **Visitors?**

This year, we will not allow visitors to camp. However, pastoral staff from your church is welcome to pay a visit with permission from the property where you are attending camp.

### Can I bring my own golf cart?

No, outside golf carts are not allowed on the property. If someone in your group has limited mobility you can request rides from our property staff.

## **Tax Exempt**

Due to the updated sales tax regulations which took effect January 1, 2023, we now require all groups to provide a copy of their Kentucky sales tax exemption certificate to not charge sales tax on camp registration fees. Please submit this form via your online registration account here. It must be a Kentucky Sales Tax form (exemption forms from other states do not work), preferably in the attached form 51A126.

If you do not have a sales tax exemption certificate, we would suggest your organization consider filing an application for one. Below are some simple instructions to do so. If we do not receive a form by two weeks prior to your camp session, you will be required to pay the 6% KY sales tax.

In order to apply for a Kentucky sales tax exemption certificate, follow the below process. Applications are processed in 2-4 weeks.

- □ 1. Fill out the attached form 51A125 Sales Tax Exemption Application.
- □ 2. This form must be signed by an authorized representative from your organization.
- 3. As noted on the back of the form, you need to include three attachments:
  - a. Either articles of incorporation or bylaws
  - b. A sample monthly (or annual) income statement
  - c. IRS organization approval letter that you are a 501c3 (Churches are not required to provide proof of 501c3)
- ☐ 4. If you are an out of state organization, you must include a copy of your exemption letter to show proof of exemption from sales tax in your state.
- 5. Mail the form to the address below.

#### What is FunFangle?

FunFangle is a cashless spending account system that frees your camper from having to carry cash or a credit card around with him/her at camp. Funds can be deposited electronically before campers arrive at camp, and parents have access to see spending or even make additional deposits while the camper is away. Each camper is given a wristband that connects to his/her account, and only needs to scan the band at the register to make purchases.

### Is FunFangle required?

No, FunFangle is optional. We take cash, credit/debit cards, and checks.

### How do I activate my account?

You should, after completing your Crossings Participant Registration, receive an email from FunFangle with a link to access your account. If you did not receive the email within 24 hours, check your spam folder first. If you still don't see an email, you can go to <a href="https://crossings.funfangle.camp">https://crossings.funfangle.camp</a> to set up an account. Make sure you use the same email address that you used to register your camper.

### How do I reset my password?

At the bottom of the login screen, you can request a password recovery code. This will send the code to your email (check your spam). You will have one hour to return to the login screen to enter the code. Do not enter the code on the login screen. Rather, at the bottom of the screen go to the page "Enter Validation Code". Enter the code there and reset your password.

### How do I make a deposit?

Log into your FunFangle account. Click on one of your campers, then click the blue "Deposit" button to the right. This will guide you to choose how much to deposit per camper, and how you want the funds handled at the end of the week. Funds deposited are available immediately to your camper.

Please make your initial deposit prior to your camper's arrival at camp. We cannot take initial deposits once your camper arrives at camp.

## Does FunFangle take a fee out of my deposit?

We cover all processing fees. Your camper will receive the full amount of the deposit in their spending account.

## Can I transfer funds to another sibling at the end of the week?

Yes, you will have 48 hours to transfer to another sibling before the funds are processed for refund or donation.

## Can another camper use my child's account?

The wristbands must be cut off once they are secured to the camper's wrist, so there is little chance of another camper using the wristband. We have the added security of photo identification. If you upload a photo in your FunFangle Parent Portal, that photo pops up for confirmation whenever someone tries to spend from the account.

#### What if my child loses their wristband?

Your camper's money will be safe. They can be issued another wristband and the original wristbands will no longer be connected to your camper's account.

### How does the spending limit work?

The spending limit per day on the purchase of snacks and drinks serves as a warning that the camper has reached his daily limit.

## Can someone other than the parent make a deposit?

Yes, inside your FunFangle account, navigate on the left hand menu to "Account" then "Contributors". From the contributors page, you can enter their information. The system will send them an invite to contribute to the campers you provide permissions for them to contribute to. Contributors cannot see how much money others have contributed to the camper or what camper may have purchased with others' money.

## Do I have to set up an account for my camper to go to the store at camp?

No. Your child may use cash or credit for their purchases.

## What happens to my camper's account balance at the end of camp?

When you make a deposit, you are asked if you want any remaining funds over \$5.00 to be refunded to you or donated to camp at the end of the camp session (Any balance under \$5.00 will automatically become a donation.) We process these refunds within 72 hours of the end of the session. It could take up to 5 business days for the funds to be deposited back into the account they were originally deposited from.
