Crossings Housing Policy

Crossings has 2 types of lodging: Single-church housing (lodges and cabins) and multi-church lodging. The following housing policy applies to both.

Single-Church Housing

- Mandatory minimums are required to occupy single-church lodges/cabins. If the group's final registration number is less than the mandatory minimum for the selected housing, the group will be moved to multi-church lodging.
- Group leaders and chaperones are responsible for supervision of their students while in their housing. Crossings recommends a ratio of 1 chaperone per 5 campers of each gender. We will allow the ratio to go to a maximum of 1 chaperone per 7 campers of each gender.
- Crossings Camps will provide a bed for each camper that attends camp. Groups may decide to use cots (provided by Crossings) to add campers to rooms to keep their group together. This option requires group leaders to make a housing request to our staff and there is no discount provided. Crossings may refuse to issue cots if it interferes with our fire safety protocols.

Cedar Crest campus at Cedarmore: groups staying at Cedar Crest MUST provide transportation to and from the main property each day. There is a one mile gravel road linking Cedar Crest to the edge of the main property, and it is too far to walk. Golf carts are not permitted to make the trip to and from Cedar Crest due to the gravel road.

Multi-Church Housing

• <u>ALL</u> multi-church lodging requires groups to share rooms and common spaces with other groups. With the number of groups coming to camp, all

multi-church lodging will *likely* be shared housing. Both males and females can/will be housed on the same level in multi-church housing.

- Group leaders and chaperones are responsible for supervision of their students while in their housing. In rooms that are shared with another group, there must be an adult chaperone from each group staying in the shared room. At least one chaperone from each group is required to stay in shared rooms. Crossings recommends a ratio of 1 chaperone per 5 campers of each gender. We will allow the ratio to go to a maximum of 1 chaperone per 7 campers of each gender.
- When groups drop spots within 2 weeks prior to camp, Crossings may assign campers from other groups to share rooms.
- Crossings Camps will provide a bed for each camper that attends camp. Groups may decide to use cots (provided by Crossings) to add campers to rooms to keep their group together. This option requires group leaders to make a housing request to our staff and there is no discount provided. Crossings may refuse to issue cots if it interferes with our fire safety protocols.
- Cedar Crest campus at Cedarmore: groups staying at Cedar Crest MUST provide transportation to and from the main property each day. There is a mile gravel road linking Cedar Crest to the edge of the main property and it is too far to walk. Golf carts are not able to make the trip to and from Cedar Crest due to the gravel drive.

<u>Overbooking</u>

If Crossings has overbooked housing, groups may be moved to a different housing location. If the new housing cost is less than the cost the group has been charged, Crossings will charge the group at the new, lower rate. If the new housing cost is greater than the group's current rate, the rate will stay the same.
